

## Below:

This drawing shows the gradual process by which the original forty-acre sections are usually subdivided. At the last stage of this progression, the interior of the original forty-acre section is filled with houses and cul-de-sacs. The pattern shown in the fourth drawing is typical of most of the urbanized areas built in Surrey after the Second World War.





## Above:

Present ownership pattern on the study site. The site is presently at the third stage of the subdivision process charted in the previous illustration. Without a change in policy, it will soon resemble the fourth stage in the previous illustration.

## Right:

Diagram illustrating how water would be collected at street edges and brought overland to the edge of the stream. During a normal rainfall, storm water would be held at the top of the stream embankment until it could percolate down through the soil.
